SECOND SESSION OF THE 11TH PARLIAMENT

Budget 2022 was passed on 14th January 2022, but not without logistical and other challenges.

New and even more stringent protocols were issued by the Health Services Sub-Committee of the National Emergency Management Organisation for the extended sitting which included: COVID tests for all Members and ancillary persons for the sitting; temperature checks, and regular sanitization of the chamber multiple times per day. However, in never before seen circumstances, several Members fell ill due to COVID in rapid succession. Thankfully, all Members have recovered.

This sitting will also be remembered as it saw the appointment and return to Parliament of Honourable Rene Baptiste, this time as a Senator for a short 1-month stint.

July 1984- 27 October 2000



Mr Calder Williams died on March 29th, 2022. Mr Williams served as the Leader of the Opposition from 27 December 1979 to 7 May 1981.



Evans B. Morgan died on 4 March, 2022. Mr Morgan was elected to the first Legislative Council in St Vincent and the Grenadines. He was the last surviving Member of the 8th Army of Liberation Political Party.
