INDIA'S PRESIDENT VISITS SVG

On Thursday 19th May, 2022 a special Sitting of the House of Assembly in honour of the official visit of His Excellency, Mr. Ram Nath Kovind, President of the Republic of India was convened at 11:15 a.m. This was an historic event being the first official visit to St. Vincent and the Grenadines by a sitting head of State of the Republic of India. The special Sitting commenced after His Excellency had inspected the Guard of Honor and was escorted to the Speaker's Office by the Speaker of the House, the Honourable Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition.





With leave granted by the Honourable Speaker, the Honourable Prime Minister moved a motion for the suspension of the Standing Orders.

The Speaker then officially commenced the sitting by extending remarks of welcome to his Excellency Mr. Ram Nath Kovind and members of his delegation.

Addresses were also made by the Honourable Prime Minister and the Honourable Leader of the Opposition, both of whom spoke of the excellent longstanding diplomatic relations between the Republic of India and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.

His Excellency then addressed the Parliament of St. Vincent and the Grenadines where his message was one premised on India's steadfast commitment to sharing its experience, knowledge and skills acquired in its journey of development, with fellow developing countries.

Following the adjournment of the Honourable House, His Excellency was introduced to Members of the House by the Honourable Prime Minister, before his departure.



PRIVATE MEMBER'S MOTION

In the regular course of business in the House, Government Business is given precedence except on the first day of the third meeting of any new session- often, but unofficially called Private Members' Day. The meeting of the 5th May, 2022 saw the moving of a motion by the Opposition Leader of the captioned, Concerning Opposition to the Development and Operation of a quarry at Richmond in North Leeward. Ordinarily, Private Members Business is concluded by 5 p.m. However, by the consensus of the House, the debate on the motion was extended to facilitate the agreed 1.5 hours of debate for each side of the House. The sitting however was prematurely interrupted (See of Bats and Standing Orders) and the Bippity Boppity Boo! suspension was taken at 8:30 p.m. The debate continued the following day and concluded on the morning of 10th May 2022. When put to the vote, the motion was lost.
